The Dodgeball game has been postponed until this Friday. Students may still purchase tickets through January 31st.



Tested Vocabulary: basketball, disease, freeze, guard, popular, sports, study, terrible



Spelling (LA Standard 3.W.6.2)

The Spelling List 19 deals with irregular plural nouns. The list was distributed Friday, the 3rd. Some students have 15 words, some have 20, and some have 25. There will be a trial test on Wednesday and a **final test** on Friday. There is a link to the spelling list on the parent information page.



English (LA Standard 3.W.6.1)

This week's grammar skill is pronouns, both singular and plural. We will review nouns and verb and basic sentence structure. There will be a **grammar quiz** on Friday.

Pronouns

Pronouns are words that take the place of nouns.
The pronoun I is ALWAYS capitalized.

Singular Pronouns

Singular Pronouns, take the place of singular nouns.

Singular Pronouns: I, me, he, she, him, her, it, you
Example: James was born. He was born.

James, you must learn to take risks.
James, you must learn to take risks.

Plural Pronouns

Plural Pronouns take the place of plural nouns.

Plural Pronouns: we, us, they, them, you

Example: The horses pulled his wagon. They pulled his wagon.


