
Mrs. Phillips' Weekly Focus March 11-15, 2018

We have I Read practice this week. We will take the actual test on the 19th.

Reading: (LA Standards 3.RN.1, 3.RN.2, 3.RN.3, 3.RN.4, 3.RV.1, 3.RV.2, 3.RF.1, 3.RF.4, 3.RF.5)

This week's story is Suki's Kimono. It is a realistic fiction story that compares and contrasts cultures. Our question of the week is How does culture influence the clothes we wear. We will work on comparing and contrasting. Next week will be a review week and then after break we will begin reading the novel Charlotte's Web as a class.



Tested Vocabulary: cotton, festival, graceful, handkerchief, paces, pale, rhythm, snug

Amazing Words (words that are good to know and expand our vocabulary, but are not tested): traditional, fret, scarves, fabric, acceptable, inspire, robe, drape, elegant, stylish

We will have an open book *comprehension quiz* over the story on Thursday and a *vocabulary quiz* on Friday.

Students will finish up book talks this week and next. We will probably only have one more book talk this year. I will put off beginning it until mid-April.

Spelling: (LA Standard 3.W.6.2)

This week's spelling list (#25) deals with consonant-vowel / vowel-consonant patterns. The list was sent home on Friday 9he 17th. Some students have 15 words, some have 20, and some have 25. There will be a trial test on Wednesday and a **final test** on Friday. The list can also be found on the Parent information page under spelling lists.

English: (LA Standard 3.W.6.1)

The Grammar rule this week is about adjectives and articles. There will be a grammar quiz on Friday.

We will continue working on writing skills.

<u>Adjectives</u>

An <u>adjective</u> is a word that can describe a person, place or thing. <u>Adjectives</u> tell more about nouns. To help you identify adjectives, find a noun, and ask the following questions: What kind? Which one? How many?

Adjectives Many people were bright clothes to the annual parade.

How many people? What kind of clothes? Which parade?

<u>Articles</u>

Articles are special adjectives. A, an, the are article adjectives.

Articles The child wore an orange sweater and a blue jacket.

- Use articles a and an with singular nouns.
- An is used before a word that begins with a vowel sound
 - O an egg, an empty box, an old coat
- Use article the before singular or plural nouns.
