
This week we take our first Language Arts **ILearn** test on Tuesday. The next tests will be next week. .

The Grammar rule this week is about conjunctions. There will be a grammar quiz on Friday. We will also be doing come opinion writing.

<u>Conjunctions</u>

A conjunction is a word that connects words or groups of words.

- To <u>add information</u>, use the conjunction <u>and</u>.
 James went to the park <u>and</u> a ball game.
- To <u>show a choice</u>, use the <u>conjunction or</u>.
 James could stay in the city <u>or</u> go back home.
- To <u>show a difference</u>, use the conjunction <u>but</u>.
 James had never been to New York City, <u>but</u> he liked it.
- You can use a conjunction to combine two sentences into a compound sentence. Add a comma (,) before the conjunction.
 James went to a ball game. Then he went home.
 James went to a ball game, and then he went home.
