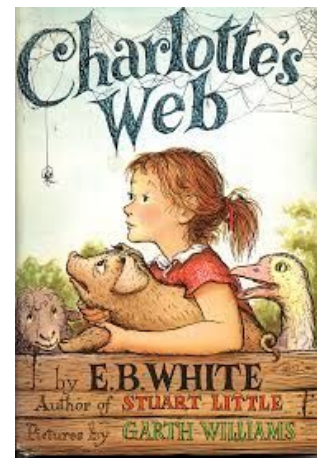

Reading: (Standards 3.RF.5, 3.RI2, 2.RL3, 3.RL4, 3.RV.2, 3.RV.3, 3.W.6)

This week we will continue reading the novel *Charlotte's Web*. We will be reading, answering comprehension questions and doing character studies in class. You should probably begin discussions about what end of the book project your child would like to do. By the end of this week, we will be finish the book. Projects will be due on the 6th of May.

Please encourage students not to watch the movies (there are three versions), as they do not follow the book and could negatively affect how they answer comprehension questions.

English: (LA Standard 3.W.6.1)

The Grammar rule this week is about capital letters. There will be a grammar quiz on Friday.

Capital Letters

Use capital letters for proper nouns and proper adjectives. Proper nouns and proper adjectives include names, names with initials, days of the week, months of the year, holidays, most words in book titles, and names of some famous periods in history. Titles for people and abbreviations of the titles should be capitalized when they are used with a person's name. Do not capitalize titles when they are used by themselves.

Incorrect: The fourth thursday in november is thanksgiving.
Correct: The fourth Thursday in November is Thanksgiving.

Incorrect: I read about a french sculptor named f. a. bartholdi.
Correct: I read about a French sculptor named F. A. Bartholdi.

Spelling: (LA Standard 3.W.6.2)

This week's spelling list (#30) is a review list. There will not be a regular spelling test on Friday. Instead I will give 10 sentences that students must write correctly. Each sentence will have a spelling word in it and will have other words that all students should be able to spell. Each sentence will be worth 5 points. All spelling, punctuation, capitalization, and neatness will count! We will practice writing sentences during the week.
