

English (LA Standard 3.W.6.1)

This week's grammar skill is on plural nouns. Students will be able to identify and correctly use singular and plural nouns. There will be a **quiz** over plural and singular nouns on Friday.

<u>Singular Nouns</u> A <u>singular noun</u> names only one person, place, or thing. Examples of singular nouns: dog, cat, boy, girl The <u>boy</u> wanted a <u>pet</u>.

Plural Nouns A <u>plural noun</u> names more than one person, place, or thing. Examples of plural nouns: dogs, cats, boys, girls
